In this issue we launch into an ocean of faith by asking the question
"Will You Walk The Water With Christ?" The Apostle Peter's heart raced

when in answer to this question Jesus held out his hand and invited him to step out of the boat onto unstable water and a violent windstorm. Peter walked on the water until he took his eyes and his mind off of Jesus and focused on the chaotic seas all around him then he started to sink.

When he saw the Lord coming he called out to Jesus. The Bible tells us "he began to shout, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me" (Mark 10:46-47)! Then he heard the voice of Jesus calling him to his side and immediately responded. What happens next is a message of hope for you and your family. Faith is trust in God. Faith is not a power that once you get it you can do anything. No! *Faith is about a relationship with Jesus*. As we learn to trust him more with our lives, our faith increases. We have a better relationship with Jesus, more trust in

him, and more faith in our hearts. When Peter realized it was truly Jesus walking on the water near their fishing boat, he said, Lord, since it is you "tell me to come to you on the water. "Come," Jesus said" (Matt 14:28-30). In other words, Peter trusted and loved Jesus with all his heart and that was his motivation to get out of the boat. Peter's faith came through his trust in Jesus. He knew Jesus as a friend and his Lord. The message is for those who feel a bit weak in faith is that ...

"The walk of faith is a growing relationship with Jesus."

As we study Peter's water walking experience we find that even when we walk by faith, there are many temptations to take back control of our lives from the Lord. On board a sinking vessel it was "every man for himself." Or don't look for help from anyone but yourself. When the storms of life strike, there is the temptation to think "I must take care of myself and my family." For Christians, Jesus Christ is always there for us. So continue your "Walk On The Water With Christ" and never doubt that if we trust him enough to put one foot on the water he will help us with the other one and never let us sink.



WILL YOU GET YOUR VISION ADJUSTED?


It's great to have an adjustment in our vision. That is even more important when it comes to seeing God clearly, because when we do, we are led to worship. There's a story in John, Chapter 9, about a man who was born blind. Remember? Jesus saw the man, made some mud from saliva, put it on the man's eyes and told him to wash in the Pool of Siloam. And just like that, the man was healed and able to see. I wonder how many times I've read that and never stopped to imagine what that must have been like. If a slight adjustment in an eyeglass prescription helps me to see more clearly, what did this man experience? He had never seen anything. His eyes were opened for the first time. Can you imagine? When hit with a number of questions and some animosity on the part of the inquirers, he exclaimed, "One thing I do know, I was blind but now I see!" (John 9:25). And when Jesus revealed himself to the man, the man worshiped him (John 9:38)

How about the story of the Apostle Paul? In his past, Paul (formerly known as Saul), was a devout Jewish leader who persecuted people who believed in Jesus, at least until that day on the road to Damascus. I find it interesting that at the moment he met the Lord, he became physically blind. Yet even in his blind state, he could see. We know this, because the Lord said that while Saul was praying, he had a vision (Acts 9:11-12). Not long thereafter his sight was restored, and he was baptized. And following his experience, he became a worshiper of

the one true God. The man who previously persecuted people became Paul intent on serving God the best way he knew which resulted in his continuous labor to open the eyes of all people with whom he came in contact. How about our stories? Most of us have not had to deal with the challenge of physical blindness, but perhaps we can all recognize the times in our past when we have been spiritually blind. Sometimes, for a multitude of reasons, our vision becomes cloudy. Trying circumstances narrow our ability to see and emotions can blindside us in the blink of an eye. And whether on a road leading to Damascus or on the freeway headed to work, likely we've all had an experience which causes us to say "How could I have been so blind?"

It takes a fresh experience with Jesus himself to open our eyes. Whether the Lord uses a sermon, a conversation with a friend or just a small whisper to our hearts, only he knows how to help us to see clearly once again. And when that happens, I believe we are led to worship, because only we know the extent of the miracle that has occurred in our own heart. I don't know about you, but I am happy to say that I can relate to the man in the book of John, because "One thing I do know is that, *I was blind but now I see.*



Boyce Jordan, III; Lorraine Evans; Annette Kirby; and Moses Cotton






As of October 2012, Our Ushers Ministry will have a new name.

What you need:


- · Bible


