

The Transformation Class



"Be not conformed to the world, but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God."

(Romans 12:2)

Is God Your Transformer?

The definition of "transform" means: to cause to change or to convert

Keep that definition in mind as we remember the TV show for kids called, "The Transformers". In this show, large robots would transform or change into different things so that they could do battle with their enemies. Their character or condition changed from what they started out as. They were converted.

The Bible tells us that we should be "transformed." We must be changed. By having the mind of Christ. God's spirit has the power to transform a person's mind, so that it begins to resemble the mind of Christ. (Romans 12:1, 2) The holy spirit produces in a person such qualities as "love, joy, peace, long-suffering, kindness, goodness, faith, mildness, self-control." These qualities—which the Bible calls "the fruitage of the spirit"—mark a truly spiritual person. (Galatians 5:22, 23) In short, a spiritually-minded person is one who was transformed and is now guided by God's spirit.

Timothy 3:16 says, "All Scripture is inspired of God and beneficial for teaching, for reproving, for setting things straight, for disciplining in righteousness", The Bible teaches us, reproves us, corrects us, and trains us in righteousness. The Word of God transforms us. It also shows us that this change should be reflected in our speech as well as our behavior. Our speaking and our actions have to be consistent with the Word of God. This is the mind of Christ. Christ never spoke or acted in a manner not consistent with God's Word. We have to stop one kind of behavior and attitude, and replace it with ANOTHER kind of behavior or attitude.

God's Word has the power to transform us. But it will not be effective for us if we are not reading, studying, and (most importantly) hearing and speaking the Word! It is the Word of God that renews our minds and truly

transform our lives. And this renewal or transformation is a process, an ongoing process. We must be transformed daily in our thinking and our actions.

When our minds are changed by the Word of God then we are transformed by the spirit so we will not conform to the world. "Transforming – it's definitely more than meets the eyes!

"Now when all the people were baptized, it came to pass, that Jesus also being baptized, and praying, the heaven was opened, And the Holy Ghost descended in a bodily shape like a dove upon him, and a voice came from heaven, which said, Thou art my beloved Son; in thee I am well pleased." Baptism strengthens the relationship between you and God, which includes greater communication. This greater communication increases the clarity to hear him better and know the deeper things of the heart of Love.

The relationship God desires to make with each person is beyond that. No matter what your religion, faith, culture or background, if you recognize the core of God as the personification of Love, you will be able to hold

all things up to that, and you will know what is of God or not. Religion is often used as a fence, whereas God prefers the freedom of open pastures. You are called to let the gifts of the Spirit work in you. You are called to being an example. By the way you act towards your family and others, you become a living testimony. When you are kind, humble, compassionate, and forgiving, you are a testimony of what a baptized person is called to be. When you are humble and pay Him a visit at the temple where you find lasting nourishment for your soul. When you earn an honest pay, when you give without expecting, when you tend to the sick or weak, when you feed the hungry, when you respect life, you are a witness of what being baptized means. It means you are willing to imitate Christ, to sacrifice your wants and desires to serve others. Baptism is a gift, as you don't have to do anything or pay to receive it. It only requires that you open your heart and soul. Baptism gives us hope, that if we live a Christian life, we will find the doors of heaven wide open for us, along with a choir of angels to welcome us, for all eternity!





The Visitor


One day, a man went to visit a church. He got there early, parked his car, and got out. Another car pulled up near and the driver got out and said, "I always park there! You took my place!"
