Love in The Biblical Sense

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Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I have become sounding brass or a clanging cymbal. And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, but have not love, it profits me nothing.

Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in

iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never fails. But whether there are prophecies, they will fail; whether there are tongues, they will cease; whether there is knowledge, it will vanish away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect has come, then that which is in part will be done away.

When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things. For now, we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know just as I also am known.

And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

The original languages of the Bible - Greek, Aramaic and Hebrew — have many different words for love. The unconditional love expressed in 1 Corinthians 13 is *Agape* in the Greek. Love comes in many forms, but biblical love is always circular. We love God and thus we love each other, therefore fulfilling Jesus' greatest commandments at John 13:34-35(NKJV) where it says: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."

Because God loved us and sent His son to die for us and not condemn us, we respond to that love by loving Him back and being loving to others we come in contact with as we go about our day. However, Our love for fellow believers goes further.

More often, though, we can show love in smaller ways. For example, if we say or do something that offends someone, we can demonstrate love by taking the initiative to restore peace. What if someone offends us? Are we "ready to forgive," or are we sometimes inclined to hold a grudge? The intense love produced by the holy spirit can help us to cover over minor transgressions, freely forgiving others "even as we are freely forgiven.

Love, in the Biblical sense, is an action, a choice that goes beyond any feelings, and sometimes in spite of them. We may need to take measures to prevent the whirlwind of daily activities from infringing on our personal time with God.



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Selfishness



Selfishness is the attitude of being concerned with one's own interests above the interests of others. Believe it or not, all of us are bound to be selfish at one time or another but the amazing thing is that a truly selfish person may not even know they are being selfish. Some people think selfishness is a good thing and that if you follow the example of Christ and put the needs of others above your own, there is no benefit for them. But all who would live a godly life, one in which we are becoming more each day like our unselfish Savior, need to view selfishness as something to deal with seriously.

The Bible tells us to "Let nothing *be done* through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others." (Philippians 2:3-4 NKJV).

Did you notice that the Apostle Paul compared selfishness to "empty conceit"—a term that could be translated "vanity" or "arrogance." It refers to an overly high opinion of oneself. It's wise to distinguish between self-love and selfishness. There is nothing wrong with respecting ourselves, protecting ourselves, and taking care of ourselves, that's the biblical thing to do. Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you."

We know this is not a good quality to possess because we see it in bible examples: The Apostle Paul wrote that in the last days selfishness will appear as self-love, self-seeking, and selfish ambition at an unprecedented level. Some will not reciprocate loving deeds, not seeing what they receive but only what more they can get. Selfishness is having too much concern with one's welfare or interests and too little or none for others. We often refer to this type of person as self-centered, self-absorbed, and self-serving.

Combating selfishness requires genuine humility. Being humble involves having a true perspective about ourselves in relation to God. Prayer and a love of Scripture are necessary





necessary as well. "Incline my heart unto thy testimonies, and not to covetousness." (Psalm 119:36 KJV). Love covers a multitude of sins, including selfishness. If we are truly "devoted to one another in brotherly love" we cannot be selfish. Having the attitude of Christ, we will demonstrate tenderness and compassion for all those we meet.

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



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
