

frustrated when I'm interrupted. As I considered my frustrations, I realized something else to be true. I needed an "*attitude adjustment*." When I feel frustrated over interruptions and obstacles, the only real solution is to change my attitude. I can't change anything else but I can change my attitude. Thinking of that during my quiet time, I read Philippians 2:6 (KJV).

"Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God"

Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: If anyone ever had the ability to change things, Jesus could have. Yet instead of changing the situation, he submitted himself to the will and plan of his Father. Instead of freeing and saving himself, he "humbled himself even further by dying a criminal's death." Why? The answer of course is love. "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). So, the only real solution to an attitude change is to have a "servant's heart" that is motivated by love. Not just when things are easy or convenient but always! Because, Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. (1 Corinthians 13:4-7 KJV).

I Was Blind But Now I See

"While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal

Matthew 6:12



I know of a man that after a number of years, he recently had his eyes examined. He knew his eyesight had changed because he could see better without wearing his glasses. As it turned out, his distance vision had improved, but he still needed glasses for driving, so he got new ones. What a difference that makes! It's so nice to put on sunglasses

and really be able to see or better yet, feel safer while driving at night. Never underestimate the need to clearly see!

It's great to have an adjustment to our vision. That is even more important when it comes to seeing God clearly, because when we do, we are led to worship. Here are some examples. There is a story in John, Chapter 9, about a man who was born blind. Jesus saw the man, made some mud and, put it on the man's eyes and told him to go to Siloam and wash. And just like that, the man was healed and able to see. I wonder how many times I have read that and never stopped to imagine what that must have been like. If a slight adjustment in an eyeglass prescription helps me to see more clearly, what did this man experience? He had never seen anything. His eyes were opened for the first time. Ever! Can you imagine? When hit with a few questions and some animosity on the part of the inquirers, he exclaimed, "One thing I do know, I was blind but now I see!" (John, verse 25). And when Jesus revealed himself to the man, the man worshiped him (verse 38)

Sometimes, for several reasons, our spiritual vision becomes cloudy. Trying circumstances narrow our ability to see and emotions can blind us in the blink of an eye. And whether on a road leading to Damascus or on the freeway headed to work, likely we have all had an experience which causes us to say, "How could I have been so blind?" Sometimes, it takes a fresh experience with Jesus himself to open our eyes. Whether the Lord use a sermon, a conversation with a friend or just a small whisper to our hearts, only he knows how to help us to see clearly again. And when that happens, I believe we are led to worship, because only we know the extent of what has occurred in our own heart. 
